Overview of Progress:

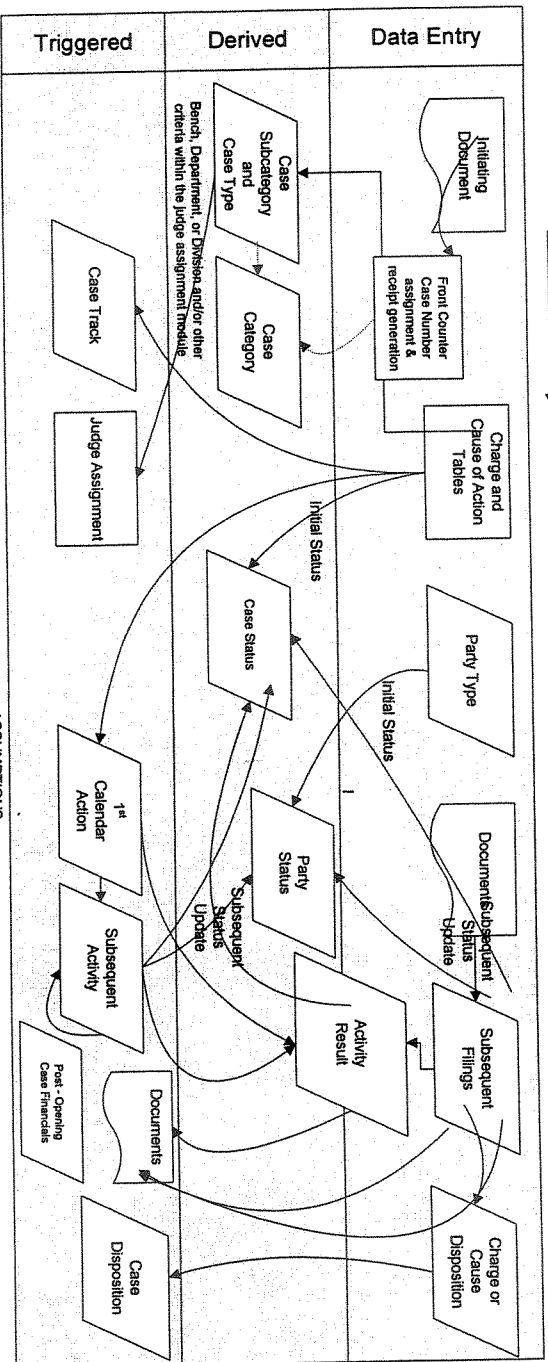
- ◆ Financials began, but review document not completed yet

AZ Code Standardization Model - Table Relationships and Method of Update



Data Entered - New values can be taken directly from data entry by clerks or from input from another application (e.g., changes received electronically from the prosecution).

Derived - New values can be taken directly from columns in originating tables, without additional processing.

Triggered - New values can be assigned from a combination of originating table columns and/or processing logic within the same application, from other applications, or from available functions (e.g., drop down box choices, additional entry routines, or comparison with other database values).

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1 - Criminal cases are accepted and counted as one defendant per case and one defendant per charge, regardless of how paperwork is submitted.
- 2 - There is a Cause of Action and final disposition for each civil case.
- 3 - Activity entries are coded fields, with supplemental fields such as due dates, with additional required text for some entries, and with some entries restricted and available only to supervisory staff.
- 4 - The details of court decisions and specific portions of proceedings will be entered as coded fields.
- 5 - Calendar hearings will be available as Activities.
