**WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS**

Justice Hurwitz welcomed members to the call at about 2:03 p.m. and took the roll of those present. He reviewed the focus on finalizing the presentation to Commission on Technology (COT) at its March 3 meeting.

**DISCUSSION ABOUT PRESENTATION**

Justice Hurwitz engaged members in a slide-by-slide discussion of the draft presentation and talking points. Most discussion revolved around the “next steps” slide and the implications of the bullets shown there. We will ask that COT route all prospective e-filing pilots through us first. We also need to provide some transition direction to current pilots once solutions are agreed to. The focus will be on getting from the general principles to specific, functional solutions with supporting policies.

Stewart will circulate the revised presentation to members prior to the COT meeting.

Justice Hurwitz asked members to please attend the COT meeting March 3, at least for the presentation.

**NEXT STEPS**

Assuming the direction and principles are ratified by COT, the subcommittee needs to turn its focus to making tangible progress on e-filing issues in the three areas. It will be time to spawn some other groups to address the specifics of implementing solutions that meet the principles. It would help to set goals and timelines for the different e-filing areas to get people focused on making change.

Justice Hurwitz asked members to begin brainstorming the challenges and issues that need to be solved as well as who needs to be included in solving them. We would then organize subteams and recruit the necessary people to join them.

Our next meeting, another conference call, will focus on the goals, organization, and timeline of the various subteams. The meeting will take place sometime during the final two weeks of March, based on a poll of members' availability.

After verifying that subcommittee members had no further business to discuss, Justice Hurwitz adjourned the meeting at 2:55 p.m.
