DOMESTIC VIOLENCE GROUP HOME
Service Code 114**

SERVICE DEFINITION:

This service provides short-term, preferably 30 days or less, out-of-home care, treatment services and family reunification services to youth who are referred to the juvenile court on domestic violence related issues or who are experiencing domestic violence related issues but are not necessarily referred for domestic violence acts.

STANDARDS/LICENSURE REQUIREMENTS:

The provider agency must be licensed by the Office of Behavioral Health Licensure (OBHL) as a Level I Residential Treatment Center, Level II Therapeutic Group Home, Level III Behavioral Health Group Home or be licensed by DES OLCR as Child Welfare Agency for Group Home Care meeting the specific requirements of A.A.C. Title R6, Chapter 5, article 74. **The preferred licensure level for this component is either the OBHL level III or licensed DES OLCR Child Welfare Agency for Group Home Care.**

Treatment services and family reunification services shall be provided by, at a minimum, a Masters degreed professional counselor who is state licensed, unless specific service components are identified in the chosen vendor's proposal which allow a paraprofessional who by training, education and experience, is qualified to deliver such services.

UNIT OF SERVICE:

One unit will be considered a residential day and will be considered a billable unit if the youth is in placement at 11:59 p.m.

SERVICE GOALS:

1. To provide a temporary safe and structured out of home setting for youth who are involved in a domestic violence situation.
2. To resolve family issues which are contributing to domestic violence.
3. To equip the youth and family with conflict resolution skills to prevent further episodes of domestic violence.

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4. To resolve differences within the family structure which are creating conflict.
5. To provide the youth and family with crisis intervention and stabilization services following reunification for a specified period of time.
6. To divert the youth from being detained.
7. To divert the youth from returning to the attention of the court system for future domestic violence related issues.

SERVICE TASKS:

1. Youth's length of stay in the placement should not exceed 30 days. Provider must clearly identify, justify and document the youth's progression of improvement in the program in order to briefly extend the youth's length of stay in the placement.
2. With all parties involved, develop a treatment plan/individual service plan which is culturally appropriate and addresses the needs of the youth and family. The treatment plan must provide for rapid family problem resolution and reunification (except where contraindicated) or alternative living treatment plan and contain recommended follow-up services within three days of placement.
3. Provide for the youth's participation in educational services as required by the Arizona Department of Education (ADE) standards.
4. Teach the youth and family non-violent conflict resolution skills and ensure their ability to use them.
5. Provide for non-custodial transportation for the youth to and from the juvenile court center, school, medical and dental appointments, home visits and others as may be requested by the referring juvenile or adult probation department.
6. Provide appropriate treatment services to the youth and family to resolve issues which are contributing to domestic violence.
7. Provide family reunification services which will allow the youth and family to be reunited in the shortest possible time frame.

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8. Provide the court with a written update for court hearings on youth's treatment and progress within the program.
9. Prepare and provide a written Discharge Summary to the probation officer within fifteen working days after the client is discharged as required by the *Standard Terms & Conditions*. The report must include progress toward treatment goals and future treatment recommendations.

SERVICE MODEL REQUIREMENTS:

1. All services proposed must be covered under the daily rate for the out of home program.
2. The chosen provider(s) will be responsible for the following outcomes:

The provider must accept any youth for program services who has been successfully discharged from the program and referred to the court on a new domestic violence related charge within 90 days of the discharge date at **no charge** to the court. **The provider will not be liable for youth who have primary family members who have unresolved alcohol or substance abuse issues.**

3. The provider will be required to collect and report the following outcome data within 30 days following the close of the fiscal year (July 1 through June 30).
 - Number of successfully discharged cases.
 - Collection of 90 day post successfully discharged cases data shall include the following; number of youth who have been re-referred to the court, number of youth who have been re-referred for a domestic violence related offense, youth's current living arrangement and school enrollment status.
 - Number of unsuccessfully discharged cases and reason for the discharge.
 - Number beds utilized and percentage of utilization per month and end of fiscal year.
4. The provider must coordinate with the AOC to determine and design the format for the report of the items listed in number 3.

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I have read and fully understand the requirements to provide a Domestic Violence Detention Alternative Program and agree to all requirements and restrictions and propose the following rate:
